## Subpart 36.7 - Standard and Optional Forms for Contracting for Construction, Architect-Engineer Services, and Dismantling, Demolition, or Removal of Improvements

Parent topic: Part 36 - Construction and Architect-Engineer Contracts

## 36.700 Scope of subpart.

This subpart sets forth requirements for the use of standard and optional forms, prescribed in <u>part 53</u>, for *contracting* for *construction*, *architect-engineer services*, or dismantling, demolition, or removal of improvements. A listing of the Standard forms is located in <u>subpart 53.3</u>.

## 36.701 Standard and optional forms for use in contracting for construction or dismantling, demolition, or removal of improvements.

- (a) <u>Standard Form 1442</u>, <u>Solicitation</u>, <u>Offer</u>, and Award (<u>Construction</u>, Alteration, or Repair), <u>shall</u> be used to solicit and submit <u>offers</u>, and award <u>construction</u> or dismantling, demolition, or removal of improvements contracts expected to exceed the <u>simplified acquisition thresholds</u>, and <u>may</u> be used for contracts at or below the <u>simplified acquisition threshold</u>. In all sealed bid <u>solicitations</u>, or when the Government otherwise requires a noncancellable <u>offer</u> acceptance period, the <u>contracting officer shall</u> insert in the blank provided in Block 13D the number of calendar days that the <u>offer must</u> be available for acceptance after the date <u>offers</u> are due.
- (b) Optional Form 347, Order for Supplies or Services, may be used for construction or dismantling, demolition, or removal of improvements contracts that are at or below the simplified acquisition threshold; provided, that the contracting officer includes the clauses required (see <u>subpart 36.5</u>) in the simplified acquisitions (see <u>part 13</u>).
- (c) Contracting officers may use Optional Form 1419, Abstract of Offers-Construction, and Optional Form 1419A, Abstract of Offers-Construction, Continuation Sheet, or the automated equivalent, to record offers submitted in response to a sealed bid solicitation (see 14.403) and may also use it to record offers submitted in response to negotiated solicitations.

## 36.702 Forms for use in contracting for architect-engineer services.

(a) Contracting officers must use <u>Standard Form 252</u>, Architect-Engineer Contract, to award fixed-price contracts for architect-engineer services when the services will be performed in the *United States* or its outlying areas.

- (b) The <u>SF 330</u>, Architect-Engineer Qualifications, *shall* be used to evaluate firms before awarding a contract for *architect-engineer services*:
- (1) Use the <u>SF 330</u>, Part I-Contract-Specific Qualifications, to obtain information from an architect-engineer firm about its qualifications for a specific contract when the contract amount is expected to exceed the *simplified acquisition threshold*. Part I *may* be used when the contract amount is expected to be at or below the *simplified acquisition threshold*, if the *contracting officer* determines that its use is appropriate.
- (2) Use the <u>SF 330</u>, Part II-General Qualifications, to obtain information from an architect-engineer firm about its general professional qualifications.
